SWA THIS YEAR ARE SUPPORTING THE BIG ISSUE CHARITY



Since The Big Issue was launched in 1991 it has helped thousands of vulnerable people take control of their lives.
Currently working with around 2000 individuals across the UK offering them the opportunity to earn a legitimate income; to 'help them to help themselves'.

Over the past two decades the magazine has become synonymous with challenging, independent journalism, and renowned for securing exclusive interviews with the most elusive of superstars. It currently circulates around 100,000 copies every week.

Vendors undergo an induction process and sign up to a code of conduct. They are allocated a pitch and issued with a number of free copies of the magazine. Last year alone, it put more than £5million in the pockets of their vendors, releasing them from a dependence on handouts and providing an alternative to begging.

Earning an income is the first step on the journey away from poverty and The Big Issue Foundation, a registered charity, exists to link vendors with vital support and services.
